



Kae Miller Trust

The Kae Miller Trust was originally called the View Road Park Society - incorporated in 1981. The aims of the society were:

To develop the View Road South / Te Raekaihau Headland Park by planting natives; establish a center for conservation strategy; build sanctuaries and care-taking lodges; offer employment and accommodation to society members; develop workshops for cottage type industries; native plant and useful plant nurseries; research of alternative building techniques; venue for family celebrations and theatrical entertainment.

By 2007 however, the society was no longer operating, so Brenda Cheyne renamed it as the Kae Miller Trust (and incorporated it), so it would be there for the community and Kae Miller would not be forgotten.

In 2013 the trust performs several vital community roles such as maintaining the Alice Krebs Lodge as a place for people to stay for rest and retreat; supporting the restoration work undertaken by TRiG and assisting other local groups involved in community building projects.
