In the 1920s the Houghton Valley Progressive Assn. was started for similar reasons. The hall was build and opened in 1929 and become the center of the community for many years. It began to decline from the late 50s on, due, according to the locals, to the increases in cars and television.

For whatever reasons, the communal spirit of the 30s was fragmented, leaving locals feeling dislocated and disenfranchised. That is now changing and the challenge is to find new and contemporary ways of developing community, rather than a remake of the old.
